

Aftercare following epithelial abrasion

AT HOME

- The eye will be more vulnerable after the operation, which is why you should wear an eye shield at night during the first 3 to 4 days after the operation. Do not rub the eye.
- If you are in pain after the operation, you can take 1 tablet paracetamol 500 mg every 6 hours and ibuprofen 400 mg every 8 hours.
- If a bandage was applied, it can be removed the morning after the operation. Start applying the eyedrops as soon as the bandage has been removed, in accordance with the prescription by the doctor.
- The ophthalmologist may have applied a bandage contact lens. This will be removed as soon as the erosion is healed (3 to 4 days).
- You can move normal. You can wash your face carefully the day after the operation. Having a shower or bath is OK, but prevent water, soap and shampoo from splashing directly into the eye during the first 3 days.
- Do not wear make-up during the first week.
- Consult your doctor to find out when you can drive again.
